

## REQUIRED TEXTS for English 101 and 102


Students who enrolled in college English 101 and 102 are required to purchase their textbooks. There are many options for acquiring these texts. These options include the following:

- Renting physical copies — these must be sent back. Rentals can be made for 3 months, 4 months, 5 months, 6 months, or a year. Keep in mind you will only need the text for the semester the class is in session.
- Renting e-books — This works much like renting the physical copy; however, you do not send it back. You merely lose access to the text.
- Purchasing physical books and e-books — These are the most expensive options, but you may keep them.
- Purchasing a used book — This is often an option, but you may have to search for it a bit. The text will cost more than renting, but less than buying a new text or an e-book.


### English 101 Text
